

SHAC Medical Clinic – By the Numbers 2021




- 610 visits in 2021 so far
- Serving predominantly Latinx patients
- Ramped back up to pre-pandemic numbers
 - Jan '21 4 patients / night
 - August '21 12 patients/ night






Gender Distribution of Patient Visits



SHAC - More than the Clinic



- Evolved as a coalition:19 total programs
- 12 departments within the clinic
- Expanded to community programs, strengthening ties in Chapel Hill and Carrboro



Outreach Program



- In partnership with UNC's Eshelman School of Pharmacy
- Services include:
 - Blood pressure & blood sugar measurements
 - Lifestyle modification counseling
 - Medication reconciliation
 - Personalized preventative health plans based on national guidelines



Social Needs Navigators



- Support patients with needs pertaining to:
 - Food security
 - Housing (rent or utility payments, safety)
 - Financial Assistance
 - Mental Health (with subsequent referral)
 - Transportation
 - Insurance
 - Legal concerns

Every patient who sees our providers also receives screening for social needs support.



Gender Affirming Care Clinic



- A safe haven to receive culturally-humble, gender-affirming care
- Services offered:
 - Prescriptions & funding for hormone therapy
 - 70% of all GACC patients are receiving full hormone scholarships (80% of those who have demonstrated need)
 - General primary care needs
 - Letters of support for surgery
 - Access to other resources or referrals within SHAC and the community

Gender Affirming Care Clinic Highlight



- New initiatives
- Trainings required for <u>all</u> volunteers prior to serving with SHAC
 - Inclusive language
 - Situational awareness

120 students trained since May 2021

Future Initiatives



- Syringe Exchange Program
 - Provide safe access for community members using needles
 - Educate community members and volunteers on naloxone use
 - Offer bridging to Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT)
- Community Advisory Board
 - Strengthen community ties
 - Receive input from community members to improve services offered
 - Listen to and understand diverse ideas from the patients we serve
